- **Grieving the Holy Spirit**
 - **Ephesians 4:30 (NKJV)** ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.
 - "Grieve" (Greek: *lupeō*) means to cause sorrow, pain, distress, or offense—like hurting someone's heart.
 - The Holy Spirit is a Person who feels deeply, and sin saddens Him because it harms us, others, and disrupts the unity and holiness He desires in our lives and the church.
 - Israel (Flesh, New self)
- **Quenching the Holy Spirit**
 - **1 Thessalonians 5:19 (NKJV)** Do not quench the Spirit.
 - "Quench" (Greek: *sbennymi*) literally means to extinguish or stifle a fire—like pouring water on flames.
 - It refers to suppressing, resisting, or smothering the Spirit's promptings, fire, gifts, guidance, or power in us.
 - Church life (Gifts)
- **Resisting**
 - Resisting the Holy Spirit is a biblical concept that describes actively opposing, rejecting, or pushing back against the Holy Spirit's work, conviction, guidance, or message.
 - The Greek word for "resist" (*anthistēmi*) carries the idea of setting oneself against something, opposing it forcefully—like rushing against or falling upon in a hostile way. It implies not passive neglect, but active opposition or refusal to yield.
 - **Acts 7:51 (NKJV)** *Israel Resists the Holy Spirit* ⁵¹ "You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers *did*, so *do* you.

Hebrews 10:29 (NKJV)

²⁹ Of how much worse punishment, do you suppose, will he be thought worthy who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, counted the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified a common thing, and insulted the Spirit of grace?

John 14:17 (NKJV)

¹⁷ the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you.

Isaiah 63:9–10 (NKJV)

⁹ In all their affliction He was afflicted, And the Angel of His Presence saved them; In His love and in His pity He redeemed them; And He bore them and carried them All the days of old.

¹⁰ But they rebelled and grieved His Holy Spirit; So He turned Himself against them as an enemy, *And* He fought against them.

Psalms 106:33 (NKJV)

³³ Because they rebelled against His Spirit, So that he spoke rashly with his lips.

Ephesians 4:17–32 (NKJV)

The New Man

¹⁷ This I say, therefore, and testify in the Lord, that you should no longer walk as the rest of the Gentiles walk, in the futility of their mind, ¹⁸ having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart; ¹⁹ who, being past feeling, have given themselves over to lewdness, to work all uncleanness with greediness.

²⁰ But you have not so learned Christ, ²¹ if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus: ²² that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, ²³ and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, ²⁴ and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness.

Do Not Grieve the Spirit
